At the beginning of July, I attended the Elks National Convention, this year held in St. Louis, Missouri. It was a wonderful venue, with a downtown setting, not unlike our own city of Detroit (not as nice, but similar). Total attendance was just under 7000 people and included Elks from all over the U.S., including Alaska and Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and Guam. Last years Grand Exalted Ruler, Michael Luhr, is in fact the first GER to be from Alaska.

Elections are a big part of what we do at the National Convention, including electing a new GER. This year, we elected Robert L. Duitsman from Culver City, California as our new leader.

The convention itself is very inspiring, with committee leadership providing inspirational presentations. The keynote speaker was Uttam Dhillon. He is the acting head of the DEA, who encouraged the Elks to continue our hard work in the area of fighting drugs. He was a terrific speaker, engaged, and thoughtful, with a wonderful message.

There were also quite a few by-laws to be voted on. Most of them were procedural, but two stand out that I wanted to outline for you. The first was a proposition that the Lodge Board of Directors automatically include the Lodge Secretary and Lodge Treasurer; this was voted down. The second was that all Lodges meet twice in the months of February, March, and April. This one was approved and we will start this in February.

And last I want to tell you about a very inspirational event that happened. The hotel that the Michigan delegation was staying at was the Hyatt where the back area is the home of the world famous Arch. While in the Michigan hospitality room, the idea came out that we should close the room at 10:45 and have our 11 O'Clock Toast on the grounds of the Arch. Several other states joined in and we ended up having 200 people, hand in hand listening to State President Chuck Oatten deliver this inspirational toast. This was a wonderful way to sort of conclude the convention. Oh, we had a few things to do the next day, including the swearing in of state officers, but in my mind, it was a great way to end a wonderful convention.

This was a great inspiring time, one that each and every Elk should participate in. Thanks for blessing me with this honor.

## 2020 MVS Scholarships

The 2020 MVS application will open on **August 5, 2019**. The 2020 Most Valuable Student scholarship contest is open to any high school senior who is a US Citizen. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

### Eligibility:

*Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.*

*Applicants need not be related to a member of the Elks.*

*High school graduates are not eligible to apply.*

*Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are signed; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.*

**Application deadline is November 5, 2019** at 11:59 PM Central Time Zone.

### Awards:

*The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2020 competition.*

*Male and female students compete separately.*

*Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.*

The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation will announce the 2020 500 national winners in late April 2020. (Many local Lodges, districts and state Elks associations award their own scholarships through this program. These scholarships are not to be confused with the 500 Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarships.)

The 20 top finalists will participate in an all expenses paid Leadership Weekend in Chicago during which they'll interview with the national judges. These 20 finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive awards of \$20,000. The 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000.
