A brief recap of what transpired down at the Beaumont Lodge.

- We sheltered and fed up to 75 evacuees and first responders the first 10 days all at Lodge cost
- Designated as FEMA distribution center where food and goods were distributed for two weeks
  - 12 members lost everything they owned
  - 20 members sustained major damage
  - Lodge AC unit was damaged at the cost of \$9,900
  - Parking lot was damaged by the distribution trucks

These are good people who did nothing to deserve such devastation, concentrated their efforts to helping others, thus living as true and upright members, caring and sharing.

Thank you Farmington Lodge for laying the path of healing for others.

Gaining speed towards Christmas, the annual Children's Christmas Party provided a full house of exuberant, friendly, happy children the joy they all deserve. The joy seen in the eyes of the grandparents, parents, family and friends was as magical as Christmas itself. Thank you, Jenn Milton, Pat & Jim Sockow, Jen Chinn and those who jumped in to help the day of the party for hitting another grand slam.

Not having the opportunity, due to press, of re-capping the entire month, I do have anticipation of rounding out December with fun, laughter and Brotherly Love within the walls of your Lodge.


### **Lodge Activities Update**

# Farmington Elks Lodge New Officers Guide

- There are 15 required officers in our lodge 11 elected and four appointed. Officers elected
  for one-year terms are the Exalted Ruler, Leading Knight, Loyal Knight, Lecturing Knight,
  Secretary and Treasurer. The five Trustees serve five-year terms with one term expiring each
  year to allow for some continuity on the board. Officers appointed each year by the Exalted
  Ruler are the Chaplain, Esquire, Inner Guard and Tiler.
- The Tiler is responsible for setting up the hall and putting the furniture away after each
  meeting and special events such as Installation and Flag Day. There are only two paid positions:
  Secretary and Treasurer. Their salaries are set by the lodge by-laws which are revised every
  five years.
- We have 22 meetings per year on the first and third Wednesdays of the month: two per month
  from September through June, and one per month in July and August (third Wednesday).
   When a meeting night falls on a holiday, we are excused by what is known as "dispensation"
  from the District Deputy.
- In addition, lodge officers are required to attend their Installation (usually in late March), the Flag Day Observance (usually the closest Sunday to June 14) and the Elks Memorial Day (first Sunday in December).
- There are rehearsals on occasion for all officers with speaking parts in the initiation ritual the four chair officers, Esquire, Chaplain and Inner Guard. These are informal sessions, usually lasting about one hour.
- Lodge officers should also attend the funerals of our departed members. While the PER Association traditionally handles the Lodge of Sorrows assistance is always welcome.
- The Exalted Ruler, three Knights and five Trustees are the voting members of both the House Committee (responsible for the club operations) and the Board of Directors (responsible for the finances of the Lodge). Meetings are held on the "off" Wednesdays of the month (second and last) and attendance of the involved officers is mandatory.
- You are responsible for purchasing your own blue blazer and khaki slacks (skirt) for regular lodge meetings. Officers involved in the ritual will also need to purchase the appropriate attire (Tuxes). These do not have to be "top of the line" clothes. The lodge pays for the neckties.
- Remember, your service to our lodge is greatly appreciated, and clearly shows that you have earned the respect and confidence of your lodge members.
