The children work towards goals of increased independence and living a fuller life.

Did YOU know that the children that attend Bay Cliff come with just the clothes on their backs? The idea is, "who the heck has clothes for a child to attend 7 weeks of therapy camp....plus, keeping track of it"!!!! So....all donations are welcome and they have an awesome facility where the laundry is done around the clock....the kiddos pick out their clothes for the next few days, returning the items for laundering, and it is meticulously sorted, folded and ready for the counselors and kids to get what is needed!!!!
