House Committee News

Members all:

We have some good news to report: we've hired Charlotte Tripp as our new bar manager. Charlotte has been volunteering here for some time and she's looking forward to her new role and to becoming a member. If you haven't met Charlotte, please stop in to welcome her. And thank Teresa for her years of service.

In other news: we have discussed this for months and looked at it from every angle, but there's no way around it — we have to raise some of our prices. We aren't looking to make more money, but there is one product line where we must stop losing money: soda pop. Our costs have increased significantly and we have to make adjustments to our selling price.

Though we hate to have to do it, effective Sunday, September 18, we will begin to charge 50 cents for soda pop mixers. A serving of plain soda pop will increase from \$1 to \$1.50. Pop in cans remains the same at \$1.50. Juice mixers also remain the same because, at least for now, our costs have not changed.

Three of our liquors will go up 25 cents: Jaegermeister, José Cuervo, and Tanqueray. We are now carrying Hendrick's Gin—same selling price as Tanqueray.

Scholarship News

2023 Most Valuable Student Contest

The 2023 MVS application is open. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

Eligibility: Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply. Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks. High school graduates are not eligible to apply. Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

2023 Legacy Awards Contest

The 2023 contest and applications open on September 1, 2022. The deadline for 2023 applications is February 6, 2023. For the 2022 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2020, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2023. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior. The applicant must apply online only. Deadline is February 6, 2023. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge. We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2023 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.

Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.
